Tonight she performs Vivaldi and Duddell with **Fantasia Orchestra**, conducted by founder **Tom Fetherstonhaugh**. Fantasia performed at the 2024 BBC Proms. This concert will include Dame Evelyn's performance of Proms at St Jude's winning student *Fanfare Competition* entry.

Tonight's performance features **Connaught Brass**, an exhilarating and virtuosic group of young performers rising in prominence across the UK and Europe, and winners at the 2022 Royal Overseas League Annual Music Competition. The *Arts Desk* describes them as 'prepared to explode clichés of what brass chamber music should sound like'. Tonight's music ranges from the 16th to the 20th centuries from Gabrieli's intricate antiphonal *Canzonas* via Debussy's *Clair de Lune* to Bernstein's ever popular *West Side Story*. Connaught Brass musicians have performed with such contrasting artists as The Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, The Jonas Brothers and Stormzy.

Red Sky at Sunrise: A Celebration of Laurie Lee in Words and Music

Red Sky at Sunrise, with actors Anton Lesser (Game of Thrones/Wolf Hall) and Charlie Hamblett (Killing Eve/The Secret Agent) has been described as a 'triumph'. It follows Laurie Lee through his much-loved trilogy. Cider with Rosie, As I Walked Out One Midsummer Morning and A Moment of War, when Lee famously fought against Franco's forces in the Spanish Civil War. The production highlights both Lee's engaging comedy and his darker side. The musical programme weaves around Lee's writing, from the lush Gloucestershire countryside Lee made famous in Cider With Rosie, to the dry landscapes of Spain, via the music of Vaughan Williams, Walton, Holst, Elgar, Britten, Albéniz, Turina and de Falla. Anton Lesser and Charlie Hamblett perform the roles of Laurie Lee older and younger, and a rich array of other characters featured in the novels. This astonishing show has sold out performances across the UK. The Orchestra of the Swan, whose 30th anniversary is this year, is led by artistic director David Le Page.

Haydn's string quartet, which *BBC Music Magazine* characterised as one of 'the greatest, most formally innovative, inventive and deeply felt string quartets ever composed' is perhaps the most magical in all Haydn's work. In 1876 Smetana was struggling to come to terms with his deafness and in the autumn of that year he started composing the intimate and nationalistic work which he subtitled *From My Life*. He wrote that the piece 'depicts my youthful leanings towards art, a Romantic atmosphere, the inexpressible yearning for something I could neither express nor define, and also a kind of warning of my future misfortune'. Featured in the renowned TV series, *Band of Brothers*, Beethoven's String Quartet No 14 is, according to *Strings* magazine, 'an unprecedentedly original and ambitious work: arguably the zenith of Beethoven's late quartets, which in themselves hold a privileged position at the core of the repertoire – for many, its holy grail'.

The only ensemble to win both First and Audience Prizes at the Premio Paolo Borciani International String Quartet Competition in Italy (2024), the **Fibonacci Quartet** is one of Europe's leading young string quartets. Following public finals at Wigmore Hall, they were selected to join the Young Classical Artist Trust roster.

Proms at St Jude's often takes place during Pride Month, and tonight - nearly 55 years to the day since the first Pride marches in June 1970, following the 1969 Stonewall Uprising we celebrate three LGBTQ+ composers and the immense contribution they have made in the history of classical music. Caroline Shaw is the youngest winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Music and described Entr'acte as 'like a minuet and trio, riffing on that classical form but taking it a little further; [it] suddenly takes you to the other side of Alice's looking glass, in a kind of absurd, subtle, technicolor transition'. American Samuel Barber's Adagio for Strings is one of the most recognisable pieces of classical music in the world - it was used at Franklin Roosevelt's funeral and after JFK's assassination - and Tchaikovsky's heartfelt Serenade for Strings is considered to be one of the late Romantic era's definitive compositions.

Nicholas Daniel OBE is one of the world's great oboists and one of Britain's best-known

musicians. He won the BBC Young Musician of the Year award in 1980 with the Vaughan Williams Oboe Concerto and has made several award-winning recordings of it over the years. Nicholas will also perform a second piece by Barber – an oboe *Canzonetta* – the middle movement of an unfinished concerto, his final work.

Tonight it's performed in its entirety almost 50 years since its original release. If you're a fan of the album – and even if you aren't – this stunning performance by this incredible ensemble is absolutely unmissable. Highlights include *Dreams, Don't Stop, Go Your Own Way, The Chain, You Make Loving Fun* and *Gold Dust Woman*.

Tonight's Last Night at Proms at St Jude's celebrates all things Italian, with arias from beloved operas by Rossini, Puccini and Verdi, treasured instrumental music, and a range of Neapolitan songs and last night favourites. Berlioz described *Harold in Italy* as a series of scenes for the orchestra that placed the viola in the midst of poetic recollections of his wanderings in the Abruzzi – a sort of melancholy dreamer after the manner of Byron's *Childe Harold*. The *Capriccio Italien* turns the sounds of Rome into an infectious invitation to dance evoking the Carnival, Italian folk music and street songs. Tchaikovsky even made use of a bugle call that he overheard from his hotel played by an Italian cavalry regiment.

United by their love of music, the **London International Concert Orchestra**'s aim is to promote the appreciation of classical music through concerts and recitals, providing opportunities for retired and working professionals, recent graduates and amateur players from all backgrounds and of all ages and nationalities to participate in music-making and platforms for up and coming soloists. It is based at Hampstead Garden Suburb's Free Church.

Imogen Whitehead is a trumpeter in demand across the UK and abroad. Today's programme features Beethoven's Sonata No 9 Kreutzer and Richard Strauss's Sonata in E flat major. The Kreutzer, regarded as the pinnacle of violin sonatas, is one of Beethoven's best-known works. At its first performance, with Beethoven on piano, the violinist George Bridgetower sight-read the score, because Beethoven had only finished it the night before. Strauss's sonata for violin and piano, with its beautiful, flowing melodies, was his last original chamber piece. International prize winner Nikola Pajanović is a Slovenian violinist currently studying at the Royal Academy of Music. His brother Stefan studied piano at the Academy of Music in Liubliana and is currently a répétiteur with the Slovenian National Opera and Ballet.



Lions! Swans! Donkeys! Hens and Roosters! Elephants! Kangaroos! *The Carnival of the Animals* is a comedic musical suite, comprised of four short movements, which was written for a bit of light relief after Saint-Saëns returned from a fairly disastrous concert tour. It is probably the work that he is best remembered for, serving as an inspiration for the score to the *Harry Potter* film franchise. Rimsky-Korsakov's orchestral interlude musically evokes the seemingly chaotic bumblebee's flying pattern. Noted children's author **James Mayhew** will be painting throughout the concert.

Golders Hill and its Glorious Trees

David Humphries, Arboricultural Manager for Hampstead Heath, will lead us around Golders Hill Park and will introduce us to some of the specimen and unusual trees, both native and introduced, for which Golders Hill is notable. David is one of London's leading experts on trees and will give us insights into the challenges of managing the trees in this award-winning park and adjacent Heath.

Sir Michael Palin

There and Back: Diaries 1999 - 2009

Comedian, actor, writer, broadcaster, BAFTA Fellow and national treasure, **Sir Michael Palin** documents the shocks of 9/11, 7/7, the war in Iraq, and the global financial crash as well as the impact of losing his great friend George Harrison and seeing his children leave home.

He reflects on his determination to avoid routine and repetition and to embrace new challenges. Here is a man with a phenomenally varied life, grasping every opportunity and embarking on his greatest adventure yet – becoming a grandfather.

Sir Vernon Bogdanor Making the Weather. Six Politicians Who Changed Modern Britain

Renowned historian and political scientist, **Sir Vernon Bogdanor** is Professor of Government at the Institute of Contemporary British History.

Making the Weather examines the major influence six iconic politicians had on post-war politics in the UK. Taking three politicians from the Left – Aneurin 'Nye' Bevan, Roy Jenkins and Tony Benn, and three from the Right – Enoch Powell, Keith Joseph and Nigel Farage, he analyses how they achieved great prominence and influence and dominated the political landscape.





Tracy Chevalier The Glassmaker

Tracy Chevalier's *The Glassmaker* is vivid, inventive and spellbinding. In 15th century Murano, women are forbidden from working with precious Venetian glass. But Orsola Rosso flouts convention to save her family from ruin, working in secret, knowing her creations must be perfect to be accepted and also knowing that achieving perfection may take a lifetime. Her creations will adorn the necks of empresses and courtesans from Paris to Vienna, but will she ever earn the respect of those closest to her?

Rough Justice: Do We Have the Law We Deserve?

Old Bailey judge **Wendy Joseph KC** examines four gripping trials over which she presided.

From the child charged with disposing of dismembered body parts, to the woman accused of killing her husband, Joseph is utterly compelling as she describes how our justice system works. Masterfully crafted, her book touches on miscarriages of justice and illuminates the struggles of anyone – but particularly the marginalised and easily exploited – who gets caught up in our legal system.



Patrick Maguire and Gabriel Pogrund

Get In: The Inside Story of Labour Under Starmer

With unrivalled access, *Sunday Times* Whitehall Editor, **Gabriel Pogrund**, and his *Times* colleague **Patrick Maguire** have written an explosive, behind the-scenes, warts-and-all account of Labour's transformation, which led to its general election victory under Sir Keir Starmer in 2024.

The book examines Starmer's single-minded pursuit of power and reveals the turmoil within the Party as he expunged opponents and attempted to unite its factions in the face of searingly divisive events.

38 Londres Street: On Impunity, Pinochet in England and a Nazi in Patagonia

In 1998 **Philippe Sands** was asked to advise Augusto Pinochet who had been indicted for genocide and crimes against humanity. He chose instead to represent a human rights group, beginning a decades-long investigation that uncovered hidden links between Nazi-era atrocities and modern-day crimes.

38 Londres Street blends memoir, detective work and courtroom drama, and connects the horrors of Pinochet's Chile with the dark past of an SS officer who fled justice, via 'the ratline', to Patagonia.

Petroc Trelawny

Trelawny's Cornwall: A Journey through Western Lands

Broadcaster and host of *Breakfast* on BBC Radio 3, **Petroc Trelawny** returns to the land of his childhood to explore his Cornish heritage and to answer the question 'do I still belong here?'.

Part history, part memoir, Petroc tells the vivid stories of a loving family full of mysteries. He visits old mines and ancient churches and ponders the collapse of Methodism, the decline of the Cornish language and the complex, sometimes lucrative, sometimes destructive, relationship with tourism.
